

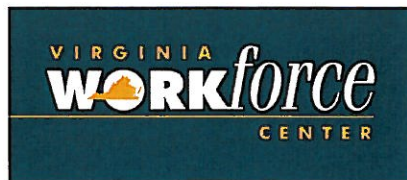


WEST PIEDMONT WORKFORCE INVESTMENT BOARD

 3. Summer employment opportunities that are directly linked to academic and occupational learning
 4. Paid and unpaid work experiences
 5. Occupational skills training
 6. Leadership Development
 7. Supportive Services
 8. Adult Mentoring
 9. Follow-up Services
 10. Comprehensive guidance and counseling

Services Delivery Process

Through a competitive grant application process, the WPWIB contracts with agencies in the region to administer employer, jobseeker, youth and Center Operator services. These agencies are:
