

Individualized Career Services Policy

Policy

- 1. The Workforce Innovation and Opportunity Act authorizes career services for adults and dislocated workers.
- 2. There are three (3) types of career services: basic career services, individualized career services, and follow-up services.
- 3. The Workforce Innovation and Opportunity Act does not require any sequence of service. Services can be provided in any order.
- 4. Career services are defined in CFR 678.430 and rules governing their provision to adults and dislocated workers are provided in 20 CFR 680.100 through 195.
- Individualized career services must be provided to participants after enrollment onto the Workforce Innovation and Opportunity Act Title I Adult or Dislocated Worker Program.
- 6. Individualized career services may be provided by the Workforce Innovation and Opportunity Title I Adult and Dislocated Worker programs.
- 7. Individualized career services are subject to priority of service requirements.
- 8. Documentation for individualized career services must be provided in the Individual Employment Plan and in the client case notes as well as in the Maryland Workforce Exchange.
- 9. Individualized career services include:
 - a. Comprehensive and specialized assessments of the skill levels and service needs of adults and dislocated workers.
 - b. Individual employment plan
 - c. Group and/or individual counseling and mentoring
 - d. Career planning (including case management)
 - e. Short-term pre-vocational services
 - f. Internships and work experiences
 - g. Workforce preparation activities
 - h. Financial literacy services
 - i. Out-of-area job search assistance and relocation assistance
 - j. English language acquisition and integrated education and training programs

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
